Black-figure pottery painting, also known as the black-figure style or black-figure ceramic (Greek, μελανόμορφη, melanomorpha) is one of the styles of painting on antique Greek vases. Ancient Greek pottery, due to its relative durability, comprises a large part of the archaeological record of ancient Greece, and since there is so much of it (over 100,000 painted vases are recorded in the Corpus vasorum antiquorum), it has exerted a disproportionately large influence on our understanding of Greek society.
