

Download Growing Perennials In Cold Climates

Believe it or not, you can grow cactus plants in cold-winter climates -- as long as you don't set your heart on the giant saguaros from your favorite John Wayne western. In warmer and more favorable climates, perennials grow continuously. In seasonal climates, their growth is limited to the growing season. In some species, perennials retain their foliage all year round; these are evergreen perennials. The Bush Clematis are close cousins to the climbing varieties, but form a bushy, upright plant suited to growing in the border. This species bears large, nodding urn-shaped flowers, in shades of bright blue.
