“At the time of the alleged offense in 1989, the Alabama Juvenile Justice Act was in effect,” Lockett’s order reads. “That Act provided that the juvenile court had original and exclusive jurisdiction over any offense involving a child who is under 18.” Supplemental jurisdiction is the authority of United States federal courts to hear additional claims substantially related to the original claim even though the court would lack the subject-matter jurisdiction to hear the additional claims independently.
